1. Go to the [www.usborne-quicklinks.com](http://www.usborne-quicklinks.com) web site.
2. Select USA as the country.
3. Enter French Songbook as keywords in the Find Book box.
4. Enter 15 as the page number.
5. Click the link entitled "Savez-vous planter les choux" to hear the song.

or for vocabulary words, follow these steps instead:

3. Enter French Picture Dictionary as the keyword in the Find Book box.
4. Select the range of words containing the English word for the French word you would like to hear. For example, for "Hello", scroll down and click on the link entitled "hat to honey (pages 36-37)". Then click on the link entitled "hello - bonjour". You should hear a nice lady say "bonjour".
